A. Problem Statement

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) requests \$13.360 million Federal Trust Fund, in 2025-26 and 2026-27 to allow California to spend increased federal grants awarded from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) and National Highway Traffic Safety Administration for increased commercial vehicle inspections, personnel and enforcement activities.

The CHP received an increase in grants from the FMCSA for the Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) through the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. In 2022-23 the grant awarded from the MCSAP program totaled \$29.093, compared to the previous year award of \$18.710. The CHP submitted a one-time request via Control Section 28.0 of the 2024 Budget Act to increase CHP's federal authority by \$10.383 million due to this additional grant award.

In 2024-25, the CHP received \$30.737 million from the MCSAP program and \$1.333 million from the High Priority (HP) Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) Grant Program for a total of \$32.071 million, for a total increase of \$13.360 million since 2021-22.

B. Justification

The federal MCSAP and HP Grant Programs were created to conduct CMV traffic enforcement, as well as truck, cargo tank, hazardous material, and passenger vehicle inspections to reduce CMV-involved accidents, fatalities, and injuries.

The CHP's Commercial Enforcement Program consists of personnel who conduct roadside inspections on CMVs at fixed Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Facilities (CVEF) and Mobile Road Enforcement locations. During the 2024 calendar year, CHP's Commercial Enforcement Program conducted 453,321 in the state, inspections.

During these inspections, approximately 46.2 percent had documented violations, and approximately 15.5 percent of those violations were placed in non-operational status (out-of-service) due to an unsafe condition. Overall, during 2024, 489,151 violations were discovered on vehicles during inspections. Additionally, CHP commercial inspectors are placing approximately 3.9 percent of CMV drivers, or 14,889 drivers, out-of-service due to a driver-related violation; approximately 15.3 percent of vehicles, or 57,198 vehicles, out-of-service due to an unsafe condition; and placed vehicles out-of-service due to unsafe hazardous material shipments approximately 2.2 percent of inspections.

The use of FMCSA grant funding has helped contribute to the discovery and removal of these unsafe vehicles and drivers through strike force operations, purchase of equipment, and funding of designated personnel, such as sergeants, officers, and commercial vehicle inspection specialists. The FMCSA funding also funds a Staff Services Manager I and three Associate Governmental Program Analysts to process all strike force operations and grant-related paperwork. Finally, the FMCSA grant funding paid for personnel to work approximately 3,000 strike force operations conducting CMV inspections statewide during CY 2024.

As a result of the increase of FMCSA grant funding beginning in 2022-23, the number of CMV-related crashes has decreased year over year. The following percentages indicate the decrease of CMV-related crashes from the prior year:

- 2022 2.9 percent decrease
- 2023 9.7 percent decrease
- 2024 17.3 percent decrease

The reduction in CMV-related crashes has contributed to the overall mileage death rate decrease in California. In 2024, the California MDR decreased by approximately 7.5 percent.

C. Departmentwide and Statewide Considerations

The federal funding is utilized to make the roadways in California safer through the discovery and removal of unsafe vehicles and drivers through strike force operations.

D. Outcomes and Accountability

The increase in federal spending authority will allow the CHP to continue receiving grant funding for projects, personnel, and equipment related to the MCSAP and HP Grant Programs.

E. Implementation Plan

CHP will work with the Department of Finance to have the increase implemented as soon as possible.
